What a joy to be able to write to you of the blessings and privilege of serving our Saviour Jesus Christ! First, to bring you up to date on where and why we are where we are. I came back in July to have my 6 mos. check-up and found the tumor in the prostate had grown from an eighth of an inch to a little over one-half inch. Not the best of news, but the doctor said it was still low grade because of the lack of visible blood supply. We changed meds and the PSA is going down, from 4.9 in Honduras to 3.4 to 2.7 this month (August). This is encouraging. Keep praying. Because he wanted to see me again in 2-3 months, I decided not to go back to Honduras, but to make some long overdue visits to churches. This is leading us on a really long journey. From Texas to So. California, up the coast to British Columbia, over to New York (to see the doctor), down to Florida, then back to Texas. There are churches all around the perimeter of the U.S. that its been 10 years since we have been with them. Well, this is all God's timing, so I worked on the old 95 Cherokee Jeep and did my best to get it ready for a hot trip across the South West deserts. So far we've had some wonderful meetings with churches in New Mexico, Arizona, and So. California. In Arizona, I had to have the front drive line disconnected and we have continued with the rear wheel drive. If that goes out I'll have to start looking for some oxen to pull us. Ha! Please just keep praying. He has been SO good to us and we keep meeting more of God's precious, precious family, including some of our former members of our church in Tacoma, Wa. and a cousin and her husband who just retired from pro baseball.

Concerning the work in Honduras, everything is continuing very well. How we thank God for faithful workers in the churches, who love God and the souls of other Hondurans. In Naranjitos, a work in the mountains, we are excited to be planning to build a church building with them next July with help from a church in Florida. That work had 50 last week, the building site is levelled and permission has been granted from the community to build. PTL! I got to lead the pastor's father-in-law to the Lord. He had come to visit them on horseback from the remote village where he lives, one of which we hope to visit some day. In Ojo de Agua (our first work in the mountains) we've laid tile, the front is painted and a sign has been put up. They are so proud of their new building. That work has maintained at about 50 since we left. In La Esperanza, five of the young people in the Student's Home Ministry have been saved in the last few months and thankfully bunk beds are being built. Also, the Bible Institute began this year with about a dozen students, 10 of which are remaining faithful. Bro Boanerges Moran is teaching homiletics. He is a missionary from El Salvador that we are supporting financially and our church is helping him in a new mission in Marcala, a town about an hour from La Esperanza. Our people have carried equipment, chairs, sign, etc. and will be visiting and participating in the beginning services the 17-19 of Sept. PLEASE PRAY! Here is an interesting side note on the long-term benefit of missions. The church I pastored in Tacoma, Wa. supported Frank Martin in Guatemala for many years. He is now with the Lord, but I believe his wife still works in Guatemala. A young man, whom we also support in Honduras, named Eddie is a product of the Martin's ministry. He grew up in one of their churches. He is in Honduras working with Bro. Boanerges to establish this new church. How about that for "casting your bread upon the waters?..."

Thank God for over 90 that have accepted Christ this year in the ministry in Honduras. Also, thanks to the churches that responded to our son, Brandon's request for help to go to the Philippines with Faith Baptist in Tacoma, where he has served on staff for 10 years. Your offerings of over \$2000 helped to distribute well over a million tracts and Bibles and literature and will help bring thousands to the Lord. Only eternity can reveal the fruit!
