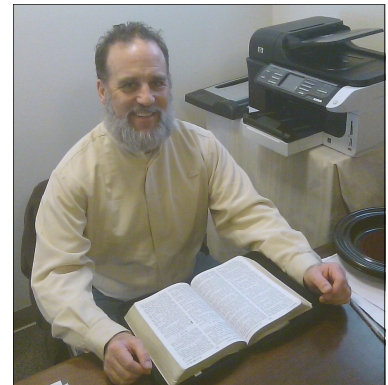
Dear Friends of CBBC,

We kicked off the New Year with “Vision Night” on January 1st. The event calendar was distributed and I preached a message focusing on our goals as a church: glorify God, growing together and going to others. I introduced a new outreach idea that has been a blessing. We call it “Tract Team Sunday” and it occurs once a month. Folks are encouraged to bring a sack lunch and attend a 15 minute class on soulwinning. Then we all go out into the community with friends or family. The goal is to train more people for soulwinning and get the gospel out. The first Tract Team Sunday was great with 16 people participating.


